U.S Department of Education Awards Nearly \$300,000 to Baltimore City School District

The U.S. Department of Education's Office of Safe and Healthy Students awarded the Baltimore City Schools a [Project School Emergency Response to Violence](#) (PSERV) grant totaling \$292,647. The grant will be used to assist with ongoing recovery efforts following the unrest in Baltimore in April 2015.

"We have to work harder and do more to ensure that our students feel safe in their schools and communities," said Ann Whalen, senior advisor to the secretary, delegated the duties of the assistant secretary of elementary and secondary education. "As adults, it is our responsibility to help protect and nurture students, especially when tragic incidents occur that affect the school environment and impact the community in such a way that hinders learning. This Project SERV grant will help the district move forward in restoring the learning environment." ([more](#))

Board Development News

The first two Boardsmanship Academy sessions were recently held at the MABE office.

This past December, Henry Johnson, Interim Deputy Superintendent for Teaching and Learning, MSDE; Heather Lageman, Director of Curriculum, MSDE; and Melissa Finkel, Education Specialist, MSDE, presented a workshop entitled *PARCC Assessments: What Every Board Member Needs to Know*.

They gave a detailed presentation on what types of assessments are used in Maryland, when and why student learning is assessed, what assessments are used, who designs and requires the assessments, and how the results are utilized. Board members also received an update on the status of the recently formed Commission to Review Maryland's use of Assessments in Public Schools.

In January, John R. Woolums, Director of Governmental Relations for MABE, presented a workshop on the Charter School Improvement Act of 2015.

Board members gained a deeper understanding of Maryland's approach to authorizing and operating public charter schools, from the Charter School Act of 2003 to the Charter School Improvement Act of 2015. Woolums and attendees explored the perceptions and realities of charter schools as public schools of choice, and the board's role in their governance.

Five Power Verbs That Elevated Our Schools

One of the promises I made upon becoming superintendent in Dorchester County, Md., about five years ago was that our business, local government and faith-based leaders would become a part of the fabric of our school system. I made this pledge after perceiving a wide disconnect between the local schools and the community at large.

Initially, the vehicle for this sought-after synergy was the formation of my Superintendent's Advisory Council. I used the first meeting of this collection of prominent leaders as a wide-ranging listening session: What's good about our public schools? How do we need to improve? How might you get involved directly with us? The positive and not-so-positive feedback they offered came with a sincerely expressed desire to "roll up their sleeves" and become involved personally. Comeback Season

A New Jersey school district and community recover from a hazing scandal

More than two decades after playing his last football game, Richard Labbe still has dreams about being on the field. "If you took Father Time away, I would never stop playing football. That's how much I love football," says Labbe, who vividly remembers his final high school and college games as an undersized lineman.

For more than a year, however, football has been the subject of nightmares for Labbe, who was named superintendent of New Jersey's Sayreville Public Schools in July 2014. Just three months later, the district's acclaimed football program, which had won six state championships and made 20 consecutive playoff appearances, became embroiled in a locker room hazing scandal that drew national attention.

Like any scandal or catastrophic event, Sayreville's story has multiple layers and details that have not-and in some cases still cannot-be made public. But what happened then and what's happened since offer valuable lessons for other school districts." ([more](#))
