Support	<a href="#">HB0068</a> <a href="#">(SB0040)</a>	<b>Interagency Commission on School Construction – Systemic Renovation Projects – Eligibility</b>	<a href="#">Delegate Watson</a>
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Requiring the Interagency Commission on School Construction to consider systemic renovation projects, regardless of cost, as eligible for funding from the Supplemental Public School Construction Financing Fund and the Supplemental Public School Construction Facilities Fund.

Support w/ Amendments	<a href="#">HB0084</a> <a href="#">(SB0119)</a>	<b>Crimes on School Grounds – Application</b>	<a href="#">Delegate Ruth</a>
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Specifying that provisions of law prohibiting and penalizing disruptive and threatening behavior on the grounds of, in the classes of, or in the home of an employee of an institution of elementary, secondary, or higher education do not apply to students who commit offenses at the institution they attend, students on exclusionary discipline who commit offenses at the institution they attend, or students who commit offenses at another institution while participating in or attending a sporting event or other extracurricular program.

Support w/ Amendments	<a href="#">SB0162</a>	<b>Public Schools – Cyber Safety Guide and Training Course – Development, Implementation, and Reporting</b>	<a href="#">Senator Hester</a>
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Requiring the State Department of Education, the Behavioral Health Administration within the Maryland Department of Health, the Maryland Center for School Safety, and the Department of Information Technology jointly to develop and publish a cyber safety guide and training course to be implemented in public schools beginning in the 2023-2024 school year.

Support w/ Amendments	<a href="#">SB0136</a>	<b>Education - Public and Nonpublic Schools - Seizure Action Plans (Brynleigh's Act)</b>	<a href="#">Delegate Kerr</a>
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Requiring a county board of education, beginning in the 2023-24 school year, to require at least 2 school personnel at each school to be trained in certain seizure recognition and response methods; requiring a public school, beginning in a certain school year, to provide in-person or online training every 2 years to school personnel with direct contact and supervision of students on certain seizure recognition and response methods; requiring MSDE and MDH to develop guidelines and a training program for school personnel.

Oppose	<a href="#">HB0146</a>	<b>Education – Reportable Offenses and Student Discipline – Alterations</b>	<a href="#">Delegate Moon</a>
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Repealing the requirement that a law enforcement agency notify the school system if a student was arrested for a reportable offense; authorizing the State’s Attorney to notify the school system about a reportable offense if a student is adjudicated delinquent or convicted of the offense.
